Arts Create - Year 2 **\$24,000**

To advance the creative economy of Texas by investing in the operations of this arts organization.

This group will do three performances a day, visiting six Title 1 schools over three days, totaling nine performances. They will drum, sing, dance, and give explanations of the song and dance for fourth through eighth grade students in Fort Worth ISD.

Artistic fee subsidy for Bill Oliver to perform in Fort Worth on January 10-14, 2011. Bill Oliver will perform as a component of Imagination Celebration's Art of Exploration presentations, serving several Title 1 schools.
