**Arts Respond Project** **\$1,700**

*To support the Cinco de Mayo Festival at Texas Lutheran University where Conjunto Juan Seguin, Ballet Folklorico De La Rosa, and mariachi musicians perform and attract visitors and provide income for musicians, artisans, technicians, and businesses.*

**Arts Respond Project** **\$3,000**

*To support providing afterschool cultural arts instruction to students in Seguin who are economically disadvantaged, at-risk, and have a history of juvenile delinquency.*
